



## **Are You Eligible?**

- ▶ WIC You may qualify if: 1)You live in Wisconsin; 2) You are pregnant, breast feeding or a new mother; 3) You have an infant or children under 5 years of age; 6) You or your children have a health or nutrition need; and 7) you have a household income (before tax deduction) that meets WIC income guidelines. - ➤ Food Stamps To get food stamps, households must meet certain tests, including resource and income tests. There are a number of allowable deductions that will affect net income. Household resources (such as a car) are also used in determining eligibility. Call Ozaukee Co. Dept. of Social Services at (262) 284-8200 or (262) 238-8200 for more information.
- ➢ Healthy Start Insurance You qualify if you are pregnant and/or have a child under 19 years of age, or need help paying for health care for you and your children. Healthy Start is part of the Medical Assistance Program (Medicaid). It pays for medical care for pregnant women, babies, and children. It covers most babies until they are one year of age, even if the family's income goes up. Families with health insurance may apply. If you are underinsured and/or you don't have health coverage for prenatal care services or the birth of the baby you may be eligible for Healthy Start. Call the Maternal and Child Health Hotline at 1-800-722-2295 for more information.
- ➢ BadgerCare Health Insurance for Working Families To be eligible: 1) You must have children under age 19 living with you; 2) Your income must be within the guideline limits; 3) There is no limit on assets; and 4) You must not be covered by health insurance. If you think you might be eligible, call 1-800-362-3002 or Ozaukee County Social Services at (262) 284-8200 or (262) 238-8200.

The Department of Health and Human Services issues the poverty guidelines each year. The guidelines are used to determine financial eligibility for certain federal programs.



Programs using the guidelines, or percentage multiples of the guidelines (for instance, 130% or 185% of the guidelines), include:

- The Food Stamp Program
- WIC
- The National School Lunch Program
- The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program
- Healthy Start Children's Health Insurance Program
- BadgerCare Health Insurance for Wisconsin Working Families

Note: The Earned Income Tax Credit program does not use the poverty guidelines to determine eligibility. Each program may have additional requirements to determine eligibility. Call your local Extension office for information on any of these resources or other related to housing, health and income.
